<p><b>Communications Skills</b> 10 credits</p>	<p>ENGL&amp; 101 (required), and ENGL&amp; 102 Northwest University and Walla Walla College require that the second English composition class be a research writing class.</p>
<p><b>Quantitative/Symbolic Reasoning Skills</b> 5 credits</p>	<p>Requires 1.5 or higher grade. UW-Seattle and Seattle University require ten credits in quantitative/symbolic reasoning with the additional class in college algebra or precalculus (at UW-Seattle, a class in Logic also serves for the additional class). Intermediate Algebra proficiency is required.</p>
<p><b>Humanities</b> 15 credits</p>	<p>Requires 1.5 or higher grade. Select from <b>two</b> disciplines. See the humanities choices in the WSU "Diversity Course Identification Guidelines" for possible selection or choose courses that include minority, non-western, ethic or other "area" studies. Selected from at least two disciplines.</p>
<p><b>Social Sciences</b> 15 credits</p>	<p>Requires 1.5 or higher grade. Northwest University requires Cultural Anthropology and does not accept a course in the sociology discipline as a substitute. Students may be admitted to the BSN without Cultural Anthropology if they agree to complete the course at NU in the summer prior to the junior year. See the sociology choices in the WSU "Diversity Course Identification Guidelines" for possible selection or choose courses that include minority, non-western, ethnic or other "area" studies.</p>
<p><b>Natural Sciences</b> 38 credits</p>	<p>Requires 1.5 or higher grade. Introductory survey courses or review courses do not meet the content level expectations for these natural science requirements. Northwest University requires two credits of Genetics as well. Students may be admitted to the BSN without Genetics if they agree to complete the course at NU in the summer prior to junior year. At the time of application when some of the course work may not yet be completed, UW-Seattle requires a minimum GPA of 3.0 for three out of the seven courses or 2.8 for four out of the seven.</p>
<p><b>General Electives</b> 10 credits</p>	<p>Minimum grade of 1.0 is required. Five credits that meet the GER-CM, GER-QS, GER-HM, GER-SS, or GER-NS requirements. Up to five credits that are numbered 100- level or above. A maximum of <b>three</b> PE activity credits can be applied to this degree. COLLG 110 required with a 2.0 grade or better.</p>
<p><b>Notes</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>•Admissions application deadlines vary; students must meet the deadline for the university or universities to which they plan to apply for admission to transfer.</li> <li>•For admission to nursing as a major it is critical to note that grade point average requirements vary and admission is competitive across the several programs in Nursing.</li> <li>•Certain schools may have additional "university-specific" requirements that are not pre-requisites to admission to the Nursing major but will need to be completed prior to graduation or, as noted above for NU, prior to commencement of nursing courses. Contact with advisor from individual schools for institutional requirements is highly recommended since this DTA may not meet every institution-specific graduation requirement. NU, for example requires Old Testament and New Testament in the summer prior to beginning nursing classes.</li> <li>•Certain schools may have additional "university-specific" requirements for admission to the institution that are not prerequisites specifically identified in the DTA requirements. US-Seattle, for example, requires ten credits of a world language if the applicant has not completed two years of a single language in high school; PLU requires a year of a world language at the college level, if two years of high school world language has not been completed.</li> </ul>
<p><b>Reciprocity Policy</b></p>	<p>Washington state community and technical colleges have adopted an Inter-College Reciprocity Policy designed to help students transfer courses that have met distribution requirements at one community or technical college to another. This policy does not address transfer of courses between two-year and four-year colleges. •Individual Courses: if a student transfers an individual course that meets a Communication Skills, Quantitative Skills or Distribution Requirement for a specific transfer degree at the sending two-year college, that courses is considered to have met the Pierce requirement for a similar transfer degree, even if the course does not have an exact equivalent at Pierce. •Distribution Areas/Specific Requirements: Pierce will accept an entire Distribution, Communication Skills, Quantitative Skills or other requirement for a transfer degree as met if that student has met certain requirements. It is the student's responsibility to initiate the reciprocity process and notify the Evaluations Office if transfer courses fall into the Inter-College Reciprocity Policy.
